



## Ensuring Equitable Access During Inequitable Times: ADA and the Ongoing COVID Pandemic

The end of the public health emergency does not mean that the pandemic is over. It simply means that the burden of harm has now been shifted to those who are most vulnerable.

This is particularly true for [those at higher risk of illness](#) from COVID infections, including disabled children and adults, older Vermonters, longhaulers, and people with certain medical conditions.

Regardless of universal policies related to COVID protections, people with disabilities have federally protected civil rights under the Americans with Disabilities Act to ensure equal access to services and places of public accommodation without incurring a greater risk of harm.

This includes healthcare (including Medicaid transportation and home-based and community services), education, government services, and civic life.

This webinar will focus on ADA protections to access medical care at a time when all COVID prevention measures are being dropped.
